## PARSON TO PERSON

Barring some unforeseen obstacles, we should finally be occupying our two new classroom portables this month (April). One portable will provide a large space, 24' x 60', for a Jr. High – Sr. High Youth Room. Pastor John is already planning the snack shop, game area and other special details to minister to students. The second portable will provide three good-sized classrooms, 20' x 24' each, for use by our Children's Ministry, AWANA and Adult ministries. These new portables will provide some breathing room for our Sunday Disciplemaking hour and Wednesday night AWANA ministries...for the present.

Notice that I said..."for the present". You see, Houston (the Space Command

Center, not our Deacons Chairman), we have a problem. God keeps adding to our church and we keep growing. We had some 350 in attendance on March 2, some 400 for Palm Sunday and 434 on Easter! Pastor John reports that he had 45 Jr. High students at Crossroads on a Monday night! It wasn't that long ago that we only had 4-5 students in our whole Youth Group!

The Site Plan Team is meeting to seek God's direction for the next step building-wise; i.e. adding some classrooms to our Preschool Building or a major project like a multi-purpose small gymnasium type building with classrooms on each end. We should have some ideas to present to you at

## JOHN'S JARGON

Parkside Peeps!  
*(Sorry, had some left over from Easter!)*

Often after spiritual events like summer camp, a retreat, or Easter there is a desire to go after God more. All of these serve as great spiritual checkpoints to encourage us not to grow complacent in our faith. Yet when we get a renewed spiritual energy we often look to ourselves to "do it right this time." It is as if we just need to pull ourselves up by the bootstraps and do it. Though I am sure that many of us would do good with a swift kick in the seat from time to time, I think the idea of, "I just need to try harder to live for God" is one of the biggest lies of the enemy!

Romans 6:11 says "*Count yourselves dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus.*" I think people often forget the last

three words of this verse and just try to be dead to sin and alive to God on their own.

If it were possible to just try harder and be able to live a life honoring to God then we would not have needed His help in the first place. Yet we still try to do it on our own, don't we?

This leads to something called legalism where we try to live by a certain set of rules to help us from getting too close to sin. (Anyone remember how this worked out for the Pharisees?) Legalism inevitably leads to judging when we see others breaking the rules we have set and view ourselves more holy or more righteous. The heart behind legalism can be great, but the result would tear our church family apart. The enemy would love to side track our attention to

# KIDS No Foolin'?

## NO CONNECTION

In the summer of 1980 in Rocklin, California the population of Rocklin suddenly grew by 50 or so persons for one week. The Mobley family reunion, held every 5 years, came to Rocklin for the first time in history. It was a historic thing for the little hometown where Larry and I met. The local newspaper covered the event. There were some in the family who had never attended one of our family reunions before and were very leery about attending. Mother's family consisted of her two parents and her 7 brothers and sisters. Each had married and most had children of their own. Mother and Dad's yard was quite large and accommodated an assortment of tents, camping trailers, motor homes, picnic tables, barbecue pits, etc. Many of us stayed at their place. Others checked into local motels or stayed with friends of the family who lived in the neighborhood. For that week there were schedules for who would do the cooking, who would do the set up before and the cleanup after meals, for laundry times, for touring the local spots of interest (the state capitol, Sutters Mill and San Francisco), for trips to Folsom lake for a cooling swim, for playing games and sharing of family stories and prayer times. After observing the family in action for several days, those who had married into the family and had been standoffish and observant at first, began to relax and enjoy the get-together. Then we heard such comments as, "I can't believe your family. My family can't be together for 15 minutes without someone throwing a punch!" Larry remembers having Limburger cheese smeared in his mouth by an adult uncle when he was 4 years old at one of their family reunions. No wonder they were leery about being there!

I remember one time when everyone was sitting around sharing family stories. It seemed that everyone was talking at the same time. Someone would tell about something from when they were kids and it would remind someone else of something and soon everyone was talking at the same time. About that time my Grandfather walked up, listened for a few moments and said to me, "Listen. This would confuse a tape recorder!"

I grew up loving these reunions. There was always lots of laughing, pulling pranks and teasing that went on. It was one of the few times I got to see my cousins on my mother's side of the family. We lived close to those on my dad's side and we had very close ties. I think those reunions helped me to see how I fit into "the grand scheme of

things". I was a part of something larger than myself. I wonder if, in our mobile society, children have that feeling of being part of something larger and of really belonging.

To me there was something very comforting about that. I guess I can't really explain it but being part of a church family can help to fulfill that void. Since my mother and father are no longer here and all of their generation has gone to be with the Lord, the reunions have somehow been lost, too. I guess it is the fault of those of us left because we haven't kept up the tradition but somehow the heart is gone out of it all since they are gone. We struggle to keep up with our own siblings since we too are aging. We try to get together with them at least once a year but getting our busy children involved is almost impossible. Is it because of where it falls on our priority lists? Is it because families are so scattered? Is it because we have just plain lost touch and have nothing in common anymore? What a shame!

Our children won't have the same sense of connectedness that we had. What always amazes me is how we in our family just took for granted that our family was just like every other family. It was such a shock to find out that ours was the exception rather than the rule. The guys that married into our family did not have the same close family feeling as we did. They have gratefully accepted it now but it was a struggle for them. But what is normal today? Is normal changing?

At Christmas time I found a game that could well be the perfect game for one of our family reunions or for April first. No foolin'. It's called Mad Gab and I'm "armed" with it now! It is a game where "--it's not what you SAY, it's what you HEAR!" The puzzles consist of a set of unrelated words that, when read aloud, sound like familiar phrases, names, places, etc. For example, "Law Sand Jealous". The idea is to say the words faster or slower or emphasize certain syllables to figure out what the puzzle says. Here is another. "Chalk Latch Hip Keys" How about "Sandy Egg Kazoo". We are enjoying this game. I think you would, too. Games do draw people together. Maybe you'd enjoy it, too. Try it!

## Board Briefs

### from the March 9th Administrative Board Meeting

As we opened the meeting, Pastor Ron announced that Bob Rettig has requested to be relieved of his Disciplemaking Chairman responsibilities as he and his family work through their grieving process and adjustments in Tami's homegoing. The Elders have asked Keith Glentzer to fill that position and Keith has accepted and was present at the meeting.

Board members shared praise and prayer requests, read and discussed Isaiah 40:28-31 and spent time in prayer together.

Mark Piper reported that the Elders continue to meet monthly with much time devoted to prayer for Parkside people. This past month they met with Women's Ministry Director Joan Daniels to hear her plans and encourage her. The Elders have again graciously granted Pastor Ron a month of Study Leave during the summer for his refreshment and the stretching and growth of Parkside and our leaders.

Deaconess Chairlady, Dee Dee Johnson shared that the Deaconesses have been busy in ministry areas and will be helping with Palm Sunday preparation and serving.

Jim Brinkerhoff reported that the Missions Faith Promises as of March 9 reflect 65 participants for a commitment of \$39,760. We praise God for that total but continue to pray for 100% involvement by Parkside people.

The February financials were distributed by Bob Fatica showing General Fund income of \$26,214 for the month, with expenses held to \$19,490. (Our Monthly Budget is \$26,700.) Bob noted that last year at the end of February we were behind by \$8,000. This year we are ahead by \$7,000! The expenses are very similar but this year's giving has been more consistent. Thank you, Lord!

Pastor Ron shared how much he was encouraged by the Shepherd's Conference led by John MacArthur. We are still seeking a Christian attorney who might help us with wills and trusts that are being prepared by the Orchard Foundation.

Board members shared regarding some of the new folks they are meeting, especially in Disciplemaking Classes, and we continue to praise God for how He adds to our church.

The Board reviewed an Injury and Illness Pre-

vention Program (Safety Policy) and unanimously adopted it. Jim Brinkerhoff will see that it is properly implemented.

Suggestions for other written policies were made (i.e. use of buildings and equipment, fundraising, new baby celebration, expense reimbursement, etc.) and Jim Brinkerhoff will do some groundwork in those areas to bring back for Board discussion and suggestions.

Everyone was very pleased with our Missions Festival this year. The banquet and speaker, An Nguyen, were excellent and well received.

Houston Wells reported that the portables were making progress and there is still a chance they can be ready by Easter. We are now waiting on sidewalks, fire alarm and burglar alarm connections.

In reviewing our 2008 Goals:

- Pastor Ron and Colleen will be meeting with those who volunteered to help with AWANA Leadership to assess what God is putting together in that ministry.
- We have several new people checking out the Disciplemaking Classes as well as Men's Ministry, Women's Ministry and Sports.
- Sherry Brinkerhoff will be heading up the Prayer Visits.
- The Disciplemaking Council is studying the best use of our new portables and the furnishings they will need.
- The Site Team of Rick Hash, Jerry Fairley, Houston Wells and Pastor Ron will be meeting soon to discuss the next building needed.
- The Deacons are working on the best use of land and the best means of landscaping our property.
- Pastor John is heading up a Video Ministry Team.
- Our Missions Team is working on several possible mission trips including: Peru, Colorado and Mexico.

The next Administrative Board meeting is scheduled for Sunday, April 13th at 5:00 p.m.

...Gary Coffee came through his surgery well.



...Colin McCowan came home from Stanford and received good results from his blood tests.
